### Football Summer Camp - 2022

SPS India Foundation of The Retreat – Don Bosco which caters to the needs and welfare of the rural tribal people has emerged with a new initiative of organizing two summer camps for the children in collaboration with the Desai Foundation Trust. One camp focuses on the well-being of the boys through football. Though it is a football camp, it focuses on various aspects of life such as physical health, personal hygiene, psychological, spiritual, cultural, educational and social.



Day 1
The inauguration of the camp was presided over by Fr. Agilan Sarprasadam SDB, the provincial of the Salesian province of Trichy and he declared open the Summer Football Camp 2022. Orientation of the camp was presented by Fr. Selvakumar SDB, the director of the SPS India Foundation. Mr. Batsha, the football coach and national referee has voluntarily come forward to train the children.

#### Day 2

The second day of the summer camp was centred on the spiritual aspect of the children. We taught them to do Surya Namaskar which is very helpful for their inner peace and good health. We began the football coaching with basic warm up exercises and ball practices. At the end, we organized a kind of small gathering where the children were introduced to group activities, action songs and claps.





#### Day 3

The third day of the camp was focused on the psychological aspect of the children. Children were taught to do several breathing exercises. These breathing exercises were welcomed by all the children. The benefits of these breathing exercises were also taught to them. Students were divided into 3 groups according to their classes. The basic exercises and skills were introduced to them and were followed up by the staff. At the end, students were taught new action song and a new clap. Their interest in learning new things is very much obvious.

#### Day 4

The fourth day of the summer camp addressed the educational and personal hygiene aspects of life. Students were given a session on importance of education, group activities, and personal cleanliness. The staff made the students to sit in a circle and checked the nails of the students to ensure that they are clean and healthy. Towards the end of the camp, students played a creative football game and the winners were appreciated.





#### Day 5

The fifth day of the camp was centred on art and craft aspect of life. After their basic warm up and ball practices, students were given a chart to draw their dream field of play. The activity of drawing using the available materials helped them to be creative in their ideas and expressions. The best drawing was rewarded by the staff. Students were able to exhibit their artistic skills in a very creative manner.

#### Day 6

The sixth day of the camp was focused on group activities and division of new teams according to the observations of the staff. Students were happy to be part of a team and they were very enthused to group activities. On this day, students were also trained to exhibit their talents and capacities on the stage.

Every day, the camp began with the morning assembly which was organized by the students themselves in English. From the second day of the camp, i.e, 17th May we began our regular class. The classes were based on English grammar and spoken English. They were been given eminent professors.





Morning hours spend through classes. On the other hand, in the afternoon, the students were given individual tasks to be completed. Moreover, they were taught phonetics to know how to pronounce the words that they may be well trained in English language skills. # Feedback of MSW Students from Sacred Heart College, Tirupattur



During my block fieldwork in The retreat- Don Bosco, yercaud, I learned how an organization is structured and how the community functions. I enriched myself with the new experience of working with the tribal peoples. The villagers of yercaud treated me well when I said; I was from the Retreat - Don Bosco. Because of their cordiality, I could easily mingle with the people; they were open-minded and told me their problems. Apart from theoretical learning, I learned much from my fieldwork. The Fieldwork learning taught me about the community problems, people's problems, needs, and experiences. Also, I learned about the duties of the community facilitator and community facilitator director. Correspondingly, I learned how they prepare and appoint the community facilitator for certain works and supervise them, especially their targets and salary basis. Further, I learned and analyzed the problem of the tribal peoples. So I was very glad to do my block fieldwork in The Retreat Don Bosco.



Through this block fieldwork, the trainee learned about the tribal people's lifestyle in Yercaud. The trainee visited the oratory on Sundays along with the Retreat brothers. It was a good experience, and the trainee met more youngsters in the oratory and understood how the Retreat Don Bosco reaches out to the youngster and the people of the village. The trainee learned about the 'Heroes for Humanity' project, which enhances the community's facilities by giving awareness and helping the needy. I learned about how the community facilitator took the survey to enhance the growth in the village. This project helped the trainee to know how to analyze people's needs and know the monitoring process, and it gave research work experience like how to create the tool and how to take the survey, and the trainee had much experience and enjoyed the fieldwork days.
