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

The highlight was the competition, where fancy dress center imagination took stage. transforming the event into a visual spectacle. The SPS India Foundation, in partnership with the Desai Foundation Trust, orchestrated from 4th to 9th of December, a week-long jewellery-making initiative for tribal women residing in the village of Manjakuttai, Yercaud. The primary goal of this program was to enhance and elevate the tribal community by offering skill development opportunities specifically tailored for women with tribal backgrounds. The participants actively took part in hands-on sessions guided by proficient and seasoned trainers, encompassing a diverse range of jewellery-making techniques. The curriculum covered essential methods such as beadwork, wire wrapping, and basic metalwork, empowering the women to craft distinctive and marketable pieces.





The commitment of the SPS India Foundation to community development was evident, as they not only supplied the required materials and tools but also underscored sustainable practices and ethical sourcing. Participants not only gained practical knowledge of the entire jewellery-making process, from design inception to the final product but also developed a comprehensive understanding of the craft. Beyond the immediate focus on skill development, the program addressed social and economic facets, promoting entrepreneurship among the tribal women. Attendees received education on market trends, pricing strategies, and the potential for establishing micro-enterprises, paving the way toward financial independence.

This week-long initiative surpassed mere skill acquisition; it fostered a sense of establishment and community among the participants. The exchange of ideas and experiences, coupled with encouragement from trainers and organizers, cultivated an empowering and supportive environment. The collaborative efforts of the SPS India Foundation and the Desai Foundation Trust exemplified the potential of amalgamating skill development with community engagement for comprehensive empowerment and a positive, enduring impact on the lives of tribal women in Yercaud.

Medical Camp at VellakadaiPromoting Health & Well-being

A medical camp, assisted by the Retreat - Don Bosco was held in Vellakadai, Yercaud. This Medical Camp was held on 3rd December 2023 on Sunday from 10.00 a.m. to 3.00 p.m. and aimed to provide accessible healthcare services to the tribals and people of remote villages, addressing various health issues and promoting overall wellbeing. Organized by Salem Policlinic Hospital, the event brought together a team of healthcare professionals, volunteers, and residents in a collaborative effort to enhance the health of the community by offering free medical check-ups and consultations to the residents of Vellakadai and to create awareness about preventive healthcare measures and promote a healthy lifestyle. A team of qualified doctors and healthcare professionals offered free consultations to individuals, addressing a wide range of health concerns. This included general check-ups, dental examinations, eye screenings, and counseling on chronic diseases and in a special way on cancer.



Essential medications were provided free of cost to individuals diagnosed with specific health conditions. This initiative aimed to ensure that individuals have access to necessary medications for their well-being. The event fostered community engagement by involving local volunteers and leaders. This collaborative effort helped in reaching a larger target group and addressing specific health concerns within the community. The Medical Camp at Vellakadai proved to be a significant step in promoting community health and well-being. By providing accessible healthcare services, raising awareness, and engaging the community, the event contributed to improving the overall health status of the residents. The success of this initiative highlights the importance of community-driven healthcare efforts and encourages the continuation of such events in the future.

This initiative has empowered women across Tamil Nadu, especially in areas like Yercaud, Salem, Dindigul, and Namakkal. The women completed assigned tasks, contributing to progress in certification and marketing. This program has instilled positivity among women, making their lives remarkable and providing self-confidence, thereby paving the way for home-based businesses.



Sharing of Gifts in Night Schools

The night schools' pre-Christmas celebrations were filled with festive spirit and joy as students, teachers, and the Retreat staff came together to usher in the holiday season. The celebration was held on the following dates from 13th to 15th of December in each night schools respectively. SPS Creates Women Entrepreneurs

A meeting was held with the Food Safety Officer in Yercaud, where the FSSAI registration certificates were distributed to newly registered entrepreneurs on December 20, 2023, at Retreat Don Bosco. Individuals from Yercaud who underwent the Entrepreneur Development Programme (EDP) and business training, registered their businesses with MSME and applied for FSSAI basic registration. Mr. Suruli, the Food Safety Officer of Yercaud, provided education and awareness to the trainees on food safety, label regulations, and more. Nine women were presented with FSSAI registration certificates during the event. Fr. Selvakumar SDB, Director of SPS India Foundation, coordinated the arrangements for the meeting, while Ms. Sangeetha, Programme Manager of Your-Backers Foundation - Siragugal, also attended.

Furthermore, Your-Backers Foundation Siragugal, in collaboration with SPS India Foundation, organized a Self-Sustainable product making workshop for women in Yercaud on October 29, 2023, at The Retreat, Yercaud, and for Dindigul women on October 31, 2023, at Don Service Centre, Dindigul. Mrs. Priyadharshini Social Bosco Ranganathan, a Self-Sustainable Living Expert, conducted training on oral care, skin care, hair care, and masala products. In Yercaud, 49 women participated, with 45 of them registering for the intensive follow-up online training on sustainable product making. From this group, 13 women were selected for the Entrepreneur Development Programme (EDP) business training. In Dindigul, 42 women participated, with 32 registering for the intensive online follow-up training for one month. Among them, three women expressed interest in undergoing EDP training. A total of 16 women were shortlisted for EDP training, and I4 actively participated in the full training session. Currently, eleven of them have successfully registered their businesses with MSME.
